Say the "St. Michael Prayer" 8. Pray the Rosary by doing one of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Joyful Mysteries - Sorrowful Mysteries - Glorious Mysteries - Luminous Mysteries

How to recite the Holy Rosary

1. SAY THESE PRAYERS...

IN THE NAME of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. (*As you say this, with your right hand touch your forehead when you say Father, touch your breastbone when you say Son, touch your left shoulder when you say Holy, and touch your right shoulder when you say Spirit.*)

I BELIEVE IN GOD, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into Hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

OUR FATHER, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

O GOD, WHOSE only-begotten Son by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life; grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

ANNOUNCE each mystery by saying something like, "*The third Joyful Mystery is the Birth of Our Lord.*" This is required only when saying the Rosary in a group.

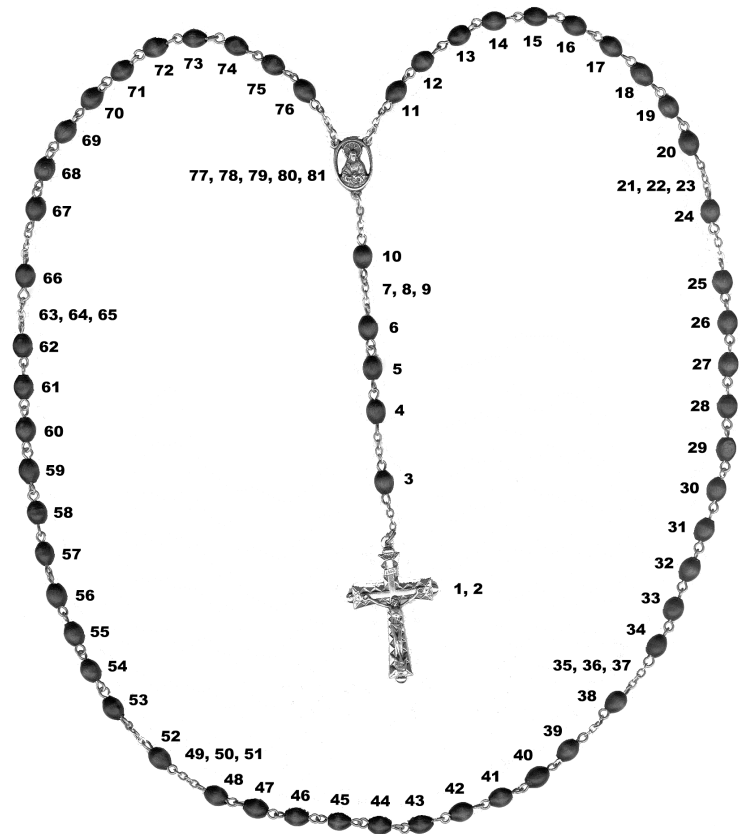

- Fifth Decade (Steps 65-78):** The Finding of Our Lord in the Temple (Luke 2:41-52)

On Thursday, meditate on the "Luminous Mysteries"

- First Decade:** The Baptism of Our Lord in the River Jordan (Matthew 3:13-16)
- Second Decade:** The Wedding at Cana, when Christ manifested Himself (Jn 2:1-11)
- Third Decade:** The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God (Mark 1:14-15)
- Fourth Decade:** The Transfiguration of Our Lord (Matthew 17:1-8)
- Fifth Decade:** The Last Supper, when Our Lord gave us the Holy Eucharist (Mt 26)

On Tuesday and Friday, meditate on the "Sorrowful Mysteries"

- First Decade:** The Agony of Our Lord in the Garden (Matthew 26:36-56)
- Second Decade:** Our Lord is Scourged at the Pillar (Matthew 27:26)
- Third Decade:** Our Lord is Crowned with Thorns (Matthew 27:27-31)
- Fourth Decade:** Our Lord Carries the Cross to Calvary (Matthew 27:32)
- Fifth Decade:** The Crucifixion of Our Lord (Matthew 27:33-56)

On Wednesday and Sunday, meditate on the "Glorious Mysteries"

- First Decade:** The Glorious Resurrection of Our Lord (John 20:1-29)
- Second Decade:** The Ascension of Our Lord (Luke 24:36-53)
- Third Decade:** The Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (Acts 2:1-41)
- Fourth Decade:** The Assumption of Mary into Heaven
- Fifth Decade:** The Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth

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Why Catholics Say the Rosary

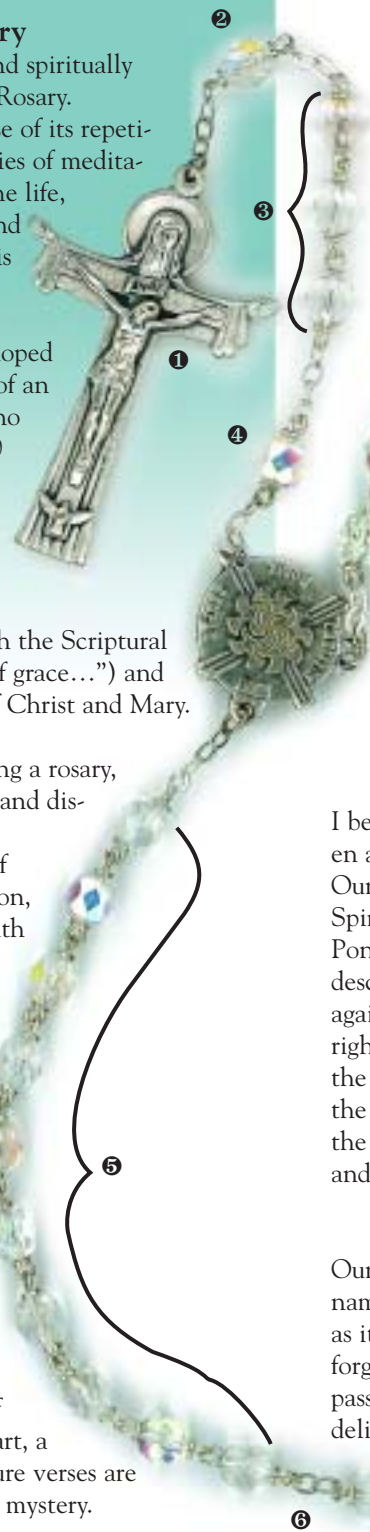
One of the most widely practiced and spiritually engaging Catholic devotions is the Rosary. Identified as a Marian prayer because of its repetition of Hail Marys, it is in fact a series of meditations (the mysteries) built around the life, death, and Resurrection of Christ and the Church's teachings regarding His mother.

The Rosary as we know it was developed in the Middle Ages. It evolved out of an ancient practice in which people who could not read Scripture recited 150 Our Fathers for the 150 Psalms. Strings of beads, called "pater-nosters," were used to keep track of the prayers.

Over time, this practice merged with the Scriptural greeting to Mary ("Hail Mary, full of grace...") and with the meditations on the lives of Christ and Mary.

One can say the Rosary without using a rosary, but the beads help keep one's place and dispose one to keep focused on prayer. People pray the Rosary in all sorts of environments: in quiet contemplation, while traveling, while exercising, with their families, or with an audiotape accompaniment. In groups or in a family, one person can say the first half of each prayer, while others respond with the second half.

When one prays the Rosary, it is important to focus not on the quantity of prayer, but on its depth. In praying the four sets of mysteries – the Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious – there is a profound encounter with the central truths of Revelation. The Rosary is, at its heart, a biblical prayer, which is why Scripture verses are often used for meditation with each mystery.



How to Pray the Rosary

Begin with the Sign of the Cross.

1 Pray the Apostles' Creed while holding the crucifix.

2 Pray an Our Father.

3 Pray three Hail Marys.

4 Pray the Glory Be, announce the first mystery, then pray an Our Father.

5 Pray ten Hail Marys (called a decade).

6 Pray the Glory Be and the Fatima Prayer.

7 Before each decade, announce the next mystery, followed by an Our Father.

For each set of ten beads, pray ten Hail Marys while meditating on the mystery.

After the five decades are completed, pray the Hail, Holy Queen.

The Joyful Mysteries

Prayed on Mondays and Saturdays

The events surrounding the coming of Our Lord, God made man, are a cause for intense joy. We meditate on these mysteries asking Our Lady to help us discover the secret of Christian joy — the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the flesh.



The Annunciation of the Lord

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph.... And he came to her and said, "Hail, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" — Luke 1:26-28

The Visitation

In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a city of Judah.... And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb. — Luke 1:39-41

The Nativity of the Lord

And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. — Luke 2:7

The Presentation of the Lord

And when the parents brought in the child Jesus ... he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said, "Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word; for mine eyes have seen thy salvation." — Luke 2:27-30

The Finding in the Temple

Prayed on Thursdays

The public life of Our Lord reveals what the reign of God's Kingdom is like — both in the miracles He worked and in His preaching. We meditate on these mysteries asking Our Lady to help us to allow His light to shine in our darkness.



The Baptism of Jesus

And when Jesus was baptized, he went up immediately from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove. — Matthew 3:16

The Wedding Feast of Cana

Jesus said to her, "O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." ... This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee. — John 2:4-5, 11

The Invitation of Jesus

Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel." — Mark 1:14-15

The Transfiguration

And as [Jesus] was praying, the appearance of his countenance was altered, and his raiment became dazzling white.... And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" — Luke 9:29-35

Prayed on Tuesdays and Fridays

The Passion and death of Our Lord reveal how much God loves us. We meditate on these mysteries asking Our Lady to help us comprehend this love and to experience its life-giving power.



The Agony in the Garden

And going a little farther [Jesus] fell on his face and prayed, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt." — Matthew 26:39

The Scourging

Then [Pilate] released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified. — Matthew 27:26

The Crowning with Thorns

And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe upon him, and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on his head, and put a reed in his right hand. — Matthew 27:28-29

The Carrying of the Cross

And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe, and put his own clothes on him, and led him away to crucify him.... They came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they compelled to carry his cross. — Matthew 27:31-32

The Crucifixion

And Jesus cried again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit. And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom; and the earth shook, and the rocks were split. — Matthew 27:50-51

Prayed on Wednesdays and Sundays

In triumph, Our Lord empowers us to follow Him courageously. We meditate on these mysteries asking Our Lady to intercede for us, that we may always keep in mind the glory of God as we seek to do His will here on earth.



The Resurrection

Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not know the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. — John 20:8

The Ascension of the Lord

He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you." ... When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. — Acts 1:7-9

The Descent of the Holy Spirit
